**HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on [REDACTED], from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by [REDACTED]. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED], Hearings Facilitator.

**ISSUE**

Did the Department properly denied the Petitioner's State Emergency Relief (SER) water application?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], the Petitioner applied for SER for assistance with her water bill in the amount of \$ [REDACTED]
2. On [REDACTED], the Department sent the Petitioner a State Emergency Relief Notice denying the Petitioner's SER application.
3. On [REDACTED], the Petitioner requested a hearing to protest the denial of her SER application.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The State Emergency Relief (SER) program is established by the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b. The SER program is administered by the Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) pursuant to MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.7001-.7049.

In this case, the Petitioner requested an SER to help pay her water bill.

The Department cites ERM 302, which states in part, “(B)efore authorizing the Department’s portion of the cost of services verified that the income and asset copayment, shortfall, and contribution have been paid by the client or will be paid by another agency.”

In the Department’s denial notice the Department mentions a copayment but doesn’t speak to the amount of the copayment paid by the Petitioner.

ERM 302 goes on to state: “Do not authorize any payment that will not resolve the current emergency, even if the payment is within the fiscal year cap.”

The documentation provided by the Department does not address the resolution of the current emergency or the amount of the copayment.

### **DECISION AND ORDER**


The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department failed to satisfy its burden of showing that it acted in accordance with Department policy when it failed to document the amount necessary to resolve the current emergency.

Accordingly, the Department’s decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Recalculate the Petitioner's SER decision and adjust its decision if appropriate.


