HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on December 14, 2016, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner was represented by herself. The Department was represented by Family Independence Specialist **Comparison** and Assistance Payments Supervisor **Comparison**. Department's Exhibit A, pages 1-16 was admitted into evidence.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's Medical Assistance (MA) eligibility on September 30, 2016?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner was an ongoing recipient of Medical Assistance (MA) benefits.
- 2. On September 30, 2016, Petitioner was sent a Health Care Coverage Determination Notice (DHHS-1606). The notice stated Petitioner was eligible for Medical Assistance (MA) as an sum monthly deductible from October 1, 2016 ongoing. The eligibility determination was based on Petitioner's monthly Social Security Administration Retirement Survivor Disability Income of Survival. The sum unearned income general exclusion was applied and Petitioner has a verified monthly insurance premium of Survival. Petitioner lives in area IV so her protected income limit is Survival. Petitioner's Countable income exceeds the Survival Petitioner's Survival Petitioner's Countable income exceeds the Survival Petitioner's Survival Petit

protected income limit so Petitioner is only eligible for Medical Assistance (MA) as an **\$440** deductible.

3. On November 7, 2016, Petitioner submitted a hearing request.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

During this hearing Petitioner's SSI Related Medicaid financial eligibility budget was reviewed. Her income, expenses and shelter area were verified. The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's Medical Assistance (MA) eligibility on September 30, 2016.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.


