HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on [REDACTED], from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Petitioner. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED], Assistance Payments Specialist.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny the Petitioner's State Emergency Relief (SER) application?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], the Petitioner applied for SER for relocation expenses and utility bills.
2. On [REDACTED] Department sent the Petitioner the SER Decision Notice informing her that her SER application had been denied because the proposed new shelter that the Petitioner intended to relocate to was not affordable (ERM 207).
3. In addition, the utility bills that the Petitioner requested assistance in paying were attached to the Petitioner's intended new address before the Petitioner moved. (ERM 301, 302).
4. On [REDACTED], the Petitioner requested a hearing to protest the denial of her SER application.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The State Emergency Relief (SER) program is established by the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b. The SER program is administered by the Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) pursuant to MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.7001-.7049.


In this case, the Petitioner applied for SER to pay utility bills for a home that she had not yet moved to. Therefore, the bills were not connected to the Petitioner's current address. (ERM 301, 302).

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied the Petitioner's SER application.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
