# **HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, an in-person hearing was held on from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Petitioner. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Hearing Facilitator, and Independence Manager.

#### **ISSUE**

Did the Department properly reduce the Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On the Department sent the Petitioner a Redetermination Form due .
- 2. On \_\_\_\_\_, the Redetermination was processed by the Department; and a Notice of Case Action was sent to the Petitioner indicating that her FAP benefits would be reduced to \$ \_\_\_\_\_.
- 3. On the Petitioner requested a hearing to protest the reduction of her FAP benefits.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

In this case, the Department reduced the Petitioner's FAP due to an increase in the Petitioner's Retirement, Survivors and Disability Insurance (RSDI) cost of living, and a failure to list ongoing medical expenses, including supplemental medical insurance, prescription costs and a monthly Part D prescription coverage fee. (BEM 550, October 1, 2015).

The undersigned ALJ reviewed the Department's FAP budget with the Petitioner and finds it to be correct and also shows that the Department correctly reduced the Petitioner's FAP benefits.

The Petitioner is advised to provide documentation of her ongoing medical expenses allowing the Department to include these expenses and increase her FAP allotment.

# **DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it reduced the Petitioner's FAP benefits.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
