HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Recoupment of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Recoupment Specialist.

The Department provided as interpreter.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly calculate the Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits overissuance (OI)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On A Recoupment, the Department sent the Petitioner a Notice and Recoupment of an FAP OI.
- 2. On the Petitioner applied for FAP benefits.
- 3. On erroneously provided an FAP OI in the amount of \$

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

In this case, Department provided evidence that the Petitioner had received a total direct refugee assistance payments of \$ ____.

The Department also testified that it had failed to calculate income from Refugee Resettlement Assistance (BEM 503, January 1, 2017).

When the Petitioner applied for FAP benefits, the Refugee Assistance Payments were not included in income when calculating the Petitioner's FAP benefits. This caused the FAP OI. (BEM 500, January 1, 2016).

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it began recoupment of \$\frac{1}{2} \text{Law}\$.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
