HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on March 15, 2017, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner was represented by herself. The Department was represented by Hearing Facilitator Department's Exhibit A, pages 1-59 was admitted into evidence.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) eligibility?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On December 19, 2016, Petitioner submitted an application for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.
- On January 13, 2017, Petitioner was sent a Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) which stated Petitioner was not eligible for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits from December 19-31, 2016 due to excess income, but was eligible for per month of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits from January 1, 2017 ongoing.
- 3. On January 23, 2017, Petitioner was sent another Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) which stated Petitioner was not eligible for Food Assistance Program (FAP)

benefits from December 19-31, 2016 due to excess income, but was eligible for per month of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits from February 1, 2017 ongoing.

- 4. On February 2, 2017, Petitioner was sent another Notice of Case Action (DHS-1605) which stated Petitioner was eligible for per month of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits from March 1, 2017 ongoing.
- 5. On February 6, 2017, Petitioner submitted a hearing request.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

During this hearing Petitioner testified that her income decreased beginning in January. The Department representative testified that a ticket had been submitted to address some issues in Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) financial eligibility budget. The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department failed to satisfy its burden of showing that it acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) eligibility.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Re-determine Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) eligibility.
