# **HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, telephone hearing was held on August 16, 2017, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner represented herself. The Department was represented by Eligibility Specialist.

# <u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly determined Petitioner's eligibility for the Food Assistance Program (FAP)?

### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner is an ongoing Food Assistance Program (FAP) recipient as a group of two.
- 2. Petitioner receives monthly child support in the gross monthly amount of Exhibit A, p 3.
- 3. A member of Petitioner's benefit group receives monthly Supplemental Security Income (SSI) in the gross monthly amount of \$ and State Supplemental Security Income (SSP) in the gross monthly amount of \$14. Exhibit A, pp 4-6.
- 4. On July 10, 2017, the Department notified Petitioner that she was approved for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits with a monthly allotment of benefits effective May 1, 2017. Exhibit A, pp 1-2.

5. On July 11, 2017, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing protesting the amount of her Food Assistance Program (FAP) grant.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

All earned and unearned income available is countable unless excluded by policy. Earned income means income received from another person or organization or from self-employment for duties for duties that were performed for compensation or profit. Unearned income means all income that is not earned, including but not limited to funds received from the Family Independence Program (FIP), State Disability Assistance (SDA), Child Development and Care (CDC), Medicaid (MA), Social Security Benefits (RSDI/SSI), Veterans Administration (VA), Unemployment Compensation Benefits (UCB), Adult Medical Program (AMA), alimony, and child support payments. The amount counted may be more than the client actually receives because the gross amount is used prior to any deductions. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 500 (January 1, 2016).

Petitioner is an ongoing FAP recipient as a group of two. Petitioner receives monthly child support in the gross monthly amount of \$\square\$ which is the amount she reported on her application for assistance. A member of Petitioner's benefit group receives monthly SSI in the gross monthly amount of \$\square\$ and SSP in the gross monthly amount of \$\square\$ which was determined by dividing her quarterly benefit by three months. Petitioner's adjusted gross monthly amount of \$\square\$ was determined by reducing her total gross monthly income by the \$\square\$ standard deduction.

Petitioner owns her own home. Petitioner is not entitled to a deduction for her monthly shelter expenses because her monthly housing expenses of \$ added to the \$ standard heat and utility deduction is less than 50% of her adjusted gross income.

Therefore, Petitioner's net monthly income is the same as her adjusted gross income. A group of two with a net income of section is entitled to a monthly allotment of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits. Department of Health and Human Services Reference Table Manual (RFT) 260 (October 1, 2016).

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined the amount of Petitioner's monthly allotment of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.

# **DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
