HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on August 23, 2017, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner was represented by herself and her grandmother, and Human Services (Department) was represented by Rasistance Payments Supervisor, Eligibility Specialist, and Worker for the Office of Child Support (OCS).

ISSUE

Did the Department properly reduce Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits and close the Petitioner's Medicaid (MA) benefits due to noncompliance with the Office of Child Support (OCS)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner was a recipient of FAP and MA, which requires her to participate with OCS to determine paternity and establish chip support pursuant to BEM 255.
- 2. On May 13, 2017, the OCS sent Petitioner a First Customer Contact Letter that Petitioner had 10 days to complete the Online Child Support Response form. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 18-19.

- 3. On May 22, 2017, the OCS sent Petitioner a Final Customer Contact Letter that Petitioner had 10 days to complete the Online Child Support Response form. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 22-23.
- 4. On June 1, 2017, the OCS sent Petitioner a Noncooperation Notice because Petitioner did not respond and she had 10 days to complete the Online Child Support Response form. Department Exhibit 1, pg. 15.
- 5. On June 2, 2017, the Department sent Petitioner a Notice of Case Action that her FAP benefits were decreasing to \$ a month effective July 1, 2017, for household group size of 1 due to the removal of the head of household due to noncooperation with OCS. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 5-8. The Notice for MA was not included in the hearing packet and was not part of the record.
- 6. On July 18, 2017, the Department received a hearing request from Petitioner, contesting the Department's negative action.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

In this case, Petitioner was a recipient of FAP and MA, which requires her to participate with OCS to determine paternity and establish chip support pursuant to BEM 255. On May 13, 2017, the OCS sent Petitioner a First Customer Contact Letter that Petitioner had 10 days to complete the Online Child Support Response form. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 18-19. On May 22, 2017, the OCS sent Petitioner a Final Customer Contact Letter that Petitioner had 10 days to complete the Online Child Support Response form. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 22-23. On June 1, 2017, the OCS sent Petitioner a Noncooperation Notice because Petitioner did not respond and she had 10 days to complete the Online Child Support Response form. Department Exhibit 1, pg. 15. On June 2, 2017, the Department sent Petitioner a Notice of Case Action that her FAP benefits were decreasing to \$\frac{1}{2}\$ a month effective July 1, 2017, for household group size of 1 due to the removal of the head of household due to noncooperation with OCS. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 5-8. The Notice for MA was not included in the hearing packet and was not part of the record. On July 18, 2017, the Department

received a hearing request from Petitioner, contesting the Department's negative action. BEM 255.

During the hearing, Petitioner stated that she was not sure about the paternity of her child, but had tried to cooperate with OCS. On June 8, 2017, and June 9, 2017, she was interviewed by OCS where she stated that she was drunk at a party in and that he was white where conception occurred on August 6, 2016, with no other possibilities. Department Exhibit 1, pg. 12. OCS told her to call back if she gets identifying information on noncustodial parent and the case to stay in noncooperation. Department Exhibit 1, pg. 12. Her Grandmother also stated that her story had not changed. However, Petitioner is required to assist OCS in establishing paternity in order to eligible for Department benefits.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner was in noncooperation with OCS resulting in a decrease in FAP benefits.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
