HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, telephone hearing was held on November 7, 2017, from Michigan. The Petitioner represented herself. The Department was represented by Family Independence Manager.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. As of October 1, 2017, the Department had been incorrectly giving Petitioner credit for ongoing medical expenses in the monthly amount of **Sector** Exhibit A, p 1.
- 2. The Department began crediting Petitioner with medical expenses in the monthly amount of **\$** based on her actual expenses. Exhibit A, p 12.
- 3. On September 21, 2017, the Department notified Petitioner that she was eligible for **\$1** monthly allotment of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits effective November 1, 2017.
- 4. On October 11, 2017, the Department notified Petitioner that she was eligible for ongoing Medical Assistance (MA) with a **Second** deductible. Exhibit A, pp 19-20.

5. On October 5, 2017, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing protesting her Medical Assistance (MA) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

All earned and unearned income available is countable unless excluded by policy. Earned income means income received from another person or organization or from self-employment for duties for duties that were performed for compensation or profit. Unearned income means all income that is not earned, including but not limited to funds received from the Family Independence Program (FIP), State Disability Assistance (SDA), Child Development and Care (CDC), Medicaid (MA), Social Security Benefits (RSDI/SSI), Veterans Administration (VA), Unemployment Compensation Benefits (UCB), Adult Medical Program (AMA), alimony, and child support payments. The amount counted may be more than the client actually receives because the gross amount is used prior to any deductions. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 500 (July 1, 2017).

Petitioner was an ongoing MA and FAP recipient in October of 2017. Due to Department error, the Petitioner was receiving credit for expenses from a hospitalization as ongoing expenses when they were not ongoing. When the Department corrected this error, Petitioner remained eligible for a **Second** monthly allotment of FAP benefits and ongoing MA benefits with a **Second** deductible.

Petitioner did not present any evidence that the Department had not properly credited her benefits with her actual obligation for ongoing expenses. The Department presented sufficient evidence to establish that it credibly determined her eligibility for ongoing MA and FAP benefits based on her actual income and expenses.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits as of November 1, 2017.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
