ORDER OF DISMISSAL
FOR LACK OF JURISDICTION


Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and MCL 400.37, and 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18, 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250, 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33, and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on January 29, 2018, from Detroit, Michigan. Petitioner was present and represented herself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED], Hearing Facilitator.

A client's request for hearing must be in writing and signed by an adult member of the eligible group, adult child, or authorized hearing representative (AHR). BAM 600 (April 2017), p. 2. Moreover, Department policy provides that a request for hearing must be received in the Department local office within 90 days of the date of the written notice of case action. BAM 600, p. 6.

In the present case, the Department sent Petitioner a Health Care Coverage Determination Notice informing him that his Medical Assistance benefit case was closing on August 29, 2017. However, Petitioner did not file a request for hearing to contest the Department's action until December 5, 2017, which is beyond 90 days of the Department's decision.

Petitioner's hearing request was not timely filed within ninety days of the Health Care Coverage Determination Notice and is, therefore, **DISMISSED** for lack of jurisdiction.
