HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on April 18, 2018, from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by her Authorized Hearing Representative (AHR), _______. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by _______. Assistance Payments Worker and _______, Eligibility Specialist.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny Petitioner's application for Medical Assistance (MA) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On December 8, 2017, Petitioner submitted an application for retroactive MA benefits (Exhibit B). Along with the application, Petitioner submitted verification of her checking and savings accounts (Exhibit E).
- 2. On January 19, 2018, the Department sent Petitioner a Health Care Coverage Determination Notice informing Petitioner that her application for MA benefits was denied (Exhibit D).
- 3. On February 5, 2018, Petitioner's AHR requested a hearing disputing the Department's actions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

In this case, Petitioner submitted an MA application on December 8, 2017. Petitioner submitted a retroactive MA application, requesting MA coverage from September 1, 2017, ongoing. Along with the MA application, Petitioner submitted verification of her checking and savings accounts.

Assets must be considered in determining eligibility for MA benefits. BEM 400 (January 2018), p. 1. Countable assets cannot exceed the applicable asset limit. BEM 400, p. 2. Asset eligibility exists when the asset group's countable assets are less than, or equal to, the applicable asset limit at least one day during the month being tested. BEM 400, p. 7. Assets in checking and savings account are countable assets. BEM 400, p.15. For SSI-related MA benefits, the asset limit for a group size of one is \$2,000.

The Department sent Petitioner notice on January 19, 2018, informing Petitioner that her application for MA benefits had been denied because she exceeded the asset limit. When looking at the checking and savings account verifications for September 2017, October 2017 and November 2017, Petitioner's combined assets never fell below \$2,000. Therefore, the Department acted in accordance with policy when it denied Petitioner's MA application.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied Petitioner's MA application. Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
