**HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on July 30, 2018, from Detroit, Michigan. Petitioner was present and represented himself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED], Hearing Facilitator.

**ISSUE**

Did the Department properly deny Petitioner's application for Medicare Savings Program (MSP) benefits?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On April 25, 2018, Petitioner applied for MSP benefits.
2. On April 26, 2018, the Department sent Petitioner a Health Care Coverage Supplemental Questionnaire (Exhibit B).
3. On May 16, 2018, the Department sent Petitioner a Health Care Coverage Determination Notice informing him that his application for MSP benefits was denied (Exhibit A).
4. On May 29, 2018, Petitioner submitted a request for hearing disputing the Department's actions.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

In this case, Petitioner submitted an application for MSP benefits April 25, 2018. On April 26, 2018, the Department sent Petitioner a Health Care Coverage Supplemental Questionnaire with a due date of May 7, 2018.

An incomplete application contains the minimum information required for registering an application. BAM 115 (October 2017), p. 5. However, it does not contain enough information to determine eligibility because all required questions are not answered for the program(s) for which the client is applying BAM 115, p. 5. The DHS-1004, Health Care Coverage Supplemental Questionnaire, is used to gather additional information when the applicant indicates a disability on an MA application. BEM 105 (April 2017), p. 3. The Department will deny an incomplete application 10 calendar days after the request is made for the client to supply the missing information. BAM 115, p. 6.

The Department presented Petitioner's electronic case file (ECF). The ECF consists of scanned documents, arranged by category and identified by a client name, recipient ID or case number, established for a particular client group. BAM 300 (October 2016), p. 1. The ECF contains all forms, documents and other evidence to the group's current and past eligibility. BAM 300, p. 1. The ECF revealed Petitioner did not return the questionnaire. Therefore, the Department acted in accordance with policy when denied Petitioner's application for MSP benefits.

**DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied Petitioner's application for MSP benefits. Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
