HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. A hearing scheduled for September 27, 2018, was adjourned. After due notice, an in-person hearing was held on October 9, 2018, from Jackson, Michigan. Petitioner was represented by her authorized hearing representative [REDACTED]s. The Department of Health and Human Services was represented by Ed Bell and Melisa Johnstone.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly deny Petitioner's application for Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], 2018, the Department received Petitioner's application for Medical Assistance (MA) and request for retroactive benefits.
2. On May 22, 2018, the Department received verification that Petitioner has a Whole Life insurance policy with a \$[REDACTED] net surrender value. Exhibit A, p 8.
3. On May 25, 2018, the Department received verification that Petitioner has a Whole Life insurance policy with a \$[REDACTED] net surrender value. Exhibit A, p 10.
4. On May 25, 2018, the Department received verification that Petitioner has a savings account with a balance of \$[REDACTED] Exhibit A, p 11.

5. On May 31, 2018, the Department notified Petitioner that she was not eligible for Medical Assistance (MA) as of February 1, 2018. Exhibit A, pp 3-6.
6. On August 23, 2018, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing protesting the denial of her application for Medical Assistance (MA). Exhibit A, pp 1-2.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

Assets means cash, any other personal property and real property. Real property is land and objects affixed to the land such as buildings, trees and fences. Condominiums are real property. Personal property is any item subject to ownership that is not real property. Countable assets cannot exceed the applicable asset limit. An asset is countable if it meets the availability tests and is not excluded. Available means that someone in the asset group has the legal right to use or dispose of the asset. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 400 (January 1, 2018), pp 1-7.

Medical Assistance (MA) is available to a person who over 65 years of age. Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 166 (April 1, 2017), p 1. The asset limit for a person over 65 years of age to receive MA benefits is \$2,000. BEM 400, p 8.

On [REDACTED], 2018, Petitioner applied for MA benefits. Petitioner provided the Department with verification of countable assets with an available value of more than \$2,000. Therefore, the Department denied Petitioner's application for MA benefits.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied Petitioner's application for Medical Assistance (MA) and retroactive Medical Assistance (MA).

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
