HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on December 6, 2018, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by herself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Richkelle Curney Hearing Facilitator. Department Exhibit 1, pp. 1-17 was received and admitted.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for Family Independence Program (FIP) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner applied for FIP benefits on ██████████ ██████████ 2018.
2. Petitioner was approved for FIP benefits for July 2018.
3. On ██████████ ██████████ Petitioner requested hearing stating "requesting back pay for Dec. 2, 2018 until now. Taken care of ██████████ ██████████ (foster care)." (Ex. 1, p.3)

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference

Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Family Independence Program (FIP) was established pursuant to the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-193, and 42 USC 601 to 679c. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FIP pursuant to 45 CFR 233-260, MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3101-.3131.

In this case, Petitioner completed a hearing request and checked the box on the hearing request for FIP. In that request, Petitioner requested “back pay for [REDACTED] [REDACTED] until now”. Petitioner applied for FIP in June 2018 and that application was properly processed. It appears based on Petitioner’s testimony at hearing that Petitioner may be seeking guardianship assistance going back to December 2017. If Petitioner is seeking guardianship assistance she should apply for that benefit through the Department.


Guardianship Assistance Act [MCL 772.871-881].

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner’s eligibility for FIP benefits.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department’s decision is **AFFIRMED**.
