HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on February 14, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner, appeared and represented herself. Hearing Facilitator, Christine Brown, appeared for the Department. Neither party had any additional witnesses.

One exhibit was admitted into evidence during the hearing. A 23-page packet of documents provided by the Department was admitted collectively as the Department's Exhibit A.

<u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department properly terminate Petitioner's Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- The Department received a completed redetermination from Petitioner, and it prompted the Department to send a Verification Checklist to Petitioner on September 10, 2018, to obtain additional information to determine her eligibility. The Verification Checklist instructed Petitioner to provide specific information by September 20, 2018.
- 2. Petitioner received the Department's Verification Checklist, but Petitioner did not Petitioner did not provide the Department with the specific information by September 20, 2018, as requested.

- 3. On December 8, 2018, the Department issued a Health Care Coverage Determination Notice which notified Petitioner that she was not eligible for MA effective January 1, 2019, because she failed to provide requested verification.
- 4. On December 18, 2018, Petitioner filed a hearing request to dispute the Department's decision.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

The Department's December 8, 2018, decision found Petitioner ineligible for MA due to her failure to provide requested verification. The Department must tell a client what verification is required, how to obtain it, and the due date. BAM 130 (April 1, 2017), p. 3. The Department must allow the client 10 calendar days to provide requested verification. BAM 130, p. 8. The client must obtain the verification, but the local office must assist if the client needs it and asks for help. BAM 130, p. 8. Verifications are only considered timely if they are received by the due date. BAM 130, p. 8. The Department must send a Negative Action Notice when the due date lapses or the client has refused to provide the verification. BAM 130, p. 8.

The Department sent Petitioner a Verification Checklist which instructed Petitioner what verification was required, how to obtain it, and the due date. It was Petitioner's responsibility to obtain the requested verification and to make sure the Department received it by the due date. Petitioner failed to provide the requested verification by the due date, so the Department properly issued a Notice of Case Action which found Petitioner ineligible for MA due to her failure to provide the requested verification.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did act in accordance with its policies and the applicable law when it found Petitioner ineligible for MA effective January 1, 2019.

IT IS ORDERED the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
