HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on June 20, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner was represented by his guardian [REDACTED]. The Department of Health and Human Services was represented by Brad Reno.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly close Petitioner's Medical Assistance (MA) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED] [REDACTED] 2019, the Department received Petitioner's Redetermination (DHS-1010).
2. On April 17, 2019, the Department sent Petitioner a Verification Checklist (DHS-3503) with an April 29, 2019 due date. This form was not sent to Petitioner's authorized representative (AR).
3. On April 30, 2019, the Department notified Petitioner that he was not eligible for Medical Assistance (MA) as of June 1, 2019.
4. On April 30, 2019, the Department notified Petitioner that he was not eligible for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits as of May 1, 2019.

5. On May 10, 2019, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing protesting the closure of Medical Assistance (MA) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

An authorized representative (AR) is a person who applies for assistance on behalf of the client and/or otherwise acts on his behalf (for example, to obtain FAP benefits for the group). The AR assumes all the responsibilities of a client. Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM) 110 (April 1, 2019), pp 1-28. It is implied that the AR also receives procedural rights of a client. The Department conceded that Claimant's AR never received a copy of the Verification Checklist (DHS-3503) sent on April 17, 2019.

Petitioner's representative expressed a willingness to provide the Department with the information necessary to accurately determine eligibility for ongoing benefits by returning the Redetermination form, but was unable to respond to the Verification Checklist (DHS-3503) form because she did not receive it. Therefore, this Administrative Law Judge find that Petitioner and his representative made a reasonable attempt to provide the Department with the requested information.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it closed Medical Assistance (MA) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.


DECISION AND ORDER

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

Initiate a determination of the Petitioner's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA) and Food Assistance Program (FAP) effective May 1, 2019.
