HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on June 26, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner represented himself. The Department of Health and Human Services was represented by Robin Morales-Oscoy.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly close Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner was an ongoing Food Assistance Program recipient on March 1, 2019, when Department sent him a Mid-Certification Contact Notice (DHS-2240-A) with a due date of April 1, 2019. Exhibit A, pp 6-8.
2. On April 10, 2019, the Department had not received the completed Mid-Certification Contact Notice, and it sent Petitioner a Notice of Potential Food Assistance Closure (DHS-2240-B) instructing him that his benefits would close effective April 30, 2019, less he complied with program requirements. Exhibit A, p 10.
3. On May 22, 2019, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing protesting the closure of his Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits. Exhibit A, pp 3-4.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

Clients must cooperate with the local office in determining initial and ongoing eligibility and this includes the completion of necessary forms. Department of Human Services Bridges Assistance Manual (BAM) 105 (January 1, 2019), p 8.

Verification means documentation or other evidence to establish the accuracy of the client's verbal or written statements. Verification is usually required at application/redetermination and for a reported change affecting eligibility or benefit level when it is required by policy, required as a local office option, or information regarding an eligibility factor is unclear, inconsistent, incomplete, or contradictory. The Department uses documents, collateral contacts, or home calls to verify information. A collateral contact is a direct contact with a person, organization, or agency to verify information from the client. When documentation is not available, or clarification is needed, collateral contact may be necessary. Department of Human Services Bridges Assistance Manual (BAM) 130 (April 1, 2017), pp 1-10.

Petitioner was an ongoing FAP recipient on March 1, 2019, when the Department sent him a Mid-Certification Contact Notice requesting that it be completed and returned by April 1, 2019. This form was addressed to Petitioner's mailing address of record. When the required form was not returned to the Department, Petitioner was notified that his FAP benefits would close.

Petitioner testified that he had his mail held at the post office.

While a presumption arises that a letter with a proper address and postage will, when placed in the mail be delivered by the postal service, this presumption can be rebutted with evidence that the letter was not received. If such evidence is presented, as it was here, then a question of fact arises regarding whether the letter was received. [Citations omitted.] *Goodyear Tire & Rubber Co v Roseville*, 468 Mich 947; 664 NW2d 751 (2003).

In this case, the Department presented substantial evidence that it mailed a Mid-Certification Contact Notice to Petitioner's mailing address of record and Petitioner failed to rebut the presumption of receipt. Although Petitioner may have chosen to not check his mail, the form was available to him and it was his responsibility to return that form.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it closed Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits effective April 30, 2019.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
