HEARING DECISION

Upon the request for a hearing by the Department of Health and Human Services (Department), this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9, and in accordance with Titles 7, 42 and 45 of the Code of Federal Regulation (CFR), particularly 7 CFR 273.16, 42 CFR 431.230(b), and 45 CFR 235.110, and with Mich Admin Code, R 400.3130 and 400.3178. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on July 30, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. The Department was represented by Jeff Welch, Assistance Payments Supervisor and Patrick Lyneaugh, Regulation Agent of the Office of Inspector General (OIG). Respondent was represented by herself, her mother,

ISSUE

Did Respondent receive an over-issuance (OI) of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits due to Department's error?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Respondent was a recipient of FAP benefits from the Department.
- 2. The Department alleges Respondent received a FAP OI during the period of October 1, 2018, through March 31, 2019, due to **Department's** error.
- 3. The Department alleges that Respondent received \$1,015.00 OI that is still due and owing to the Department.

4. On June 5, 2019, the Department received a hearing request from the Petitioner contesting the Department's negative action.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), and Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 to .3015.

In the instant case, Respondent returned to Michigan from Mississippi. She applied for FAP benefits in Michigan on October 23, 2018, and reported receiving FAP benefits in Mississippi. The Department Caseworker opened her Michigan FAP benefits in error resulting in an overissuance for the contested time period.

Additionally, Respondent was a recipient of FAP benefits from the Department. The Department alleges Respondent received a FAP OI during the period October 1, 2018, through March 31, 2019, due to **Department's** error. The Department alleges that Respondent received \$1,015.00 OI that is still due and owing to the Department.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based upon the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, finds that the Department **did** establish a FAP benefit OI to Respondent totaling \$1,015.00 due to Department's error.

Accordingly, the Department is **AFFIRMED**.

The Department is ORDERED to initiate collection procedures for a FAP OI received in the amount of \$1,015.00 in accordance with Department policy.
