HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on September 19, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner was represented by herself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Shanita Crawford, Eligibility Specialist.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for the Food Assistance Program (FAP) for the month of June 2019?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner is a recipient of FAP benefits.
2. On June 20, 2019, Petitioner submitted a Semi-Annual Contact Report, DHS-1046 and Wage Match Client Notice, DHS-4638, and check stubs, for the Department to determine her eligibility for FAP. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 3-5 and 9-15.
3. On July 23, 2019, the Department received a hearing request from Petitioner, contesting the Department negative action.
4. On August 1, 2019, the Department Caseworker sent Petitioner a Benefit Notice, DHS-176, that she was eligible for \$204.00 in FAP benefits effective July 1, 2019. Department Exhibit 1, pg. 20.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

In this case, the Petitioner was concerned about her FAP benefits for June 2019 based on the changes in her household income that she reported timely. The Department Caseworker agreed to manually do a budget to reflect the decrease in June 2019 income and manually issue a supplement. BAM 210. BEM 550.

DECISION AND ORDER


The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's eligibility for the Food Assistance Program (FAP) that did not include June 2019.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Initiate a redetermination of Petitioner's eligibility for FAP for June 2019 using the reported decrease in income.
2. Based on policy, the Department should provide Petitioner with written notification of the Department's revised eligibility determination and issue Petitioner any retroactive benefits she may be eligible to receive, if any.
