HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on December 18, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by herself and her husband, and Human Services (Department) was represented by Valerie Foley, Hearing Facilitator.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner was a recipient of MA with a redetermination due in November 2019.
- 2. On Application, DHS-1010, and check stubs from Petitioner. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 5-14.
- 3. On October 25, 2019, the Department Caseworker sent Petitioner a Health Care Coverage Determination Notice, DHS-1606, that indicated Petitioner's household

was not eligible for MA effective December 1, 2019 due to excess income. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 15-17.

4. On November 12, 2019, the Department received a hearing request from Petitioner contesting the Department's negative action.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

In this case, Petitioner stated during the hearing that the Department miscalculated her earned income. The Department conceded that an error was made in that the check stubs were unusually high and not reflective of her normal paycheck. The Department agreed to redetermine MA eligibility retroactive to December 2019. BEM 137.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it determined that Petitioner had excess income for MA.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Initiate a redetermination of Petitioner's eligibility for MA retroactive to December 2019, by determining a normal paycheck for Petitioner for a month and redetermining her eligibility for MA.

- 2. Based on policy, the Department should provide Petitioner with written notification of the Department's revised eligibility determination.
- 3. Issue Petitioner any retroactive benefits she may be eligible to receive, if any.
