**HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on January 29, 2018, from Detroit, Michigan. Petitioner was present and represented herself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Abby Sutter, Assistance Payments Supervisor, and Nicole Smith, Eligibility Specialist.

**ISSUE**

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's Medical Assistance (MA) eligibility?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner was an ongoing recipient of MA benefits under the full-coverage Health Michigan Plan (HMP).
2. On June 5, 2017, Petitioner was sent a redetermination packet to complete related to her MA case.
3. On July 19, 2017, the Department sent Petitioner a Health Care Coverage Determination notice informing her that her MA benefit case was closing due to her failure to return the redetermination.
4. On July 24, 2017, Petitioner submitted the redetermination and the Department reprocessed her MA benefit case.

5. Petitioner received \$852 in pension payments and \$905 in private disability payments. Petitioner also had income from employment in which she was paid \$180 on a biweekly basis.
6. On October 30, 2017, the Department sent Petitioner a Health Care Coverage Determination Notice informing her that she was not eligible for MA benefits effective November 1, 2017, ongoing.
7. On November 30, 2017, Petitioner submitted a request for hearing disputing the Department's actions.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

In this case, Petitioner completed a redetermination on July 24, 2017. In the redetermination Petitioner indicated that she receives monthly pension payments in the amount of \$852. Petitioner also receives payments from disability insurance in the amount of \$905 per month. Petitioner also had income from employment in which she received \$180 in each paycheck on a biweekly basis.

The Department concluded that Petitioner was not eligible for HMP because her income exceeded the applicable income limit for her group size. HMP uses a Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) methodology. BEM 137 (October 2016), p. 1. An individual is eligible for HMP if her household's income does not exceed 133% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) applicable to the individual's group size. BEM 137, p. 1. An individual's group size for MAGI-related purposes requires consideration of the client's tax filing status. In this case, Petitioner filed taxes and did not claim any dependents. Therefore, for HMP purposes, she has a household size of one. BEM 211 (January 2016), pp. 1-2.

133% of the annual FPL in 2017 for a household with one member is \$16,039.80. See <https://aspe.hhs.gov/poverty-guidelines>. Therefore, to be income eligible for HMP, Petitioner's annual income cannot exceed \$16,039.80. To determine financial eligibility

under HMP, income must be calculated in accordance with MAGI under federal tax law. BEM 500 (July 2017), p. 3. MAGI is based on Internal Revenue Service rules and relies on federal tax information. BEM 500, p. 3. Income is verified via electronic federal data sources in compliance with MAGI methodology. MREM, § 1.

In order to determine income in accordance with MAGI, a client's adjusted gross income (AGI) is added to any tax-exempt foreign income, tax-exempt Social Security benefits, and tax-exempt interest. AGI is found on IRS tax form 1040 at line 37, form 1040 EZ at line 4, and form 1040A at line 21. Alternatively, it is calculated by taking the "federal taxable wages" for each income earner in the household as shown on the paystub or, if not shown on the paystub, by using gross income before taxes reduced by any money the employer takes out for health coverage, child care, or retirement savings. This figure is multiplied by the number of paychecks the client expects in 2017 to estimate income for the year. See <https://www.healthcare.gov/income-and-household-information/how-to-report/>.


According to the Health Care Coverage Determination Notice, Petitioner's yearly income was determined to be \$25,740. Petitioner testified that she always receives \$180 per paycheck from her income from employment. Petitioner stated she is paid biweekly. When multiplying \$180 by 26 (the number of paychecks she would receive in a year) the income from employment is \$4,680. Petitioner receives a monthly disability payment of \$905, or a yearly amount of \$10,860. Petitioner also receives a monthly pension payment of \$852, or \$10,224 yearly. The total of Petitioner's income is \$25,764, which is roughly the same figure the Department calculated. The Department properly established that Petitioner's income exceeded the income limit for HMP. Therefore, the Department acted in accordance with policy when it closed Petitioner's MA benefit case.

### **DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's MA eligibility.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
