HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, telephone hearing was held on March 13, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner represented herself. The Department was represented by Dionere Craft and Fahad Ahmed.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly deny Petitioner's application for Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On January 18, 2019, the Department received verification that Petitioner is employed and that she received paychecks in the gross bi-weekly amounts of \$660.00 on January 4, 2019, and \$660.01 on January 18, 2019. Exhibit A, pp 6-7.
2. On November 29, 2018, the Department notified Petitioner that she was not eligible for Medical Assistance (MA) effective January 1, 2019. Exhibit A, pp 4-5.
3. On January 24, 2019, the Department notified Petitioner that she was not eligible for Medical Assistance (MA) effective March 1, 2019. Exhibit A, pp 8-11.
4. On January 15, 2019, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing protesting the denial of her application for Medical Assistance (MA) benefits. Exhibit A, pp 2-3.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

The income limit to participate in the Healthy Michigan Plan (HMP) is 133% of the federal poverty level. Department of Health and Human Services Reference Table Manual (RFT) 246 (April 1, 2014), p 1.

MAGI for purposes of Medicaid eligibility is a methodology which state agencies and the federally facilitated marketplace (FFM) must use to determine financial eligibility. It is based on Internal Revenue Service (IRS) rules and relies on federal tax information to determine adjusted gross income. It eliminates asset tests and special deductions or disregards. Every individual is evaluated for eligibility based on MAGI rules. The MAGI rules are aligned with the income rules that will be applied for determination of eligibility for premium tax credits and cost-sharing reductions through exchanges. Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 500 (July 1, 2017), pp 3-4.

Modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) is a methodology for how income is counted and how household composition and family size are determined. It is based on federal tax rules for determining adjusted gross income. It eliminates asset tests and special deductions or disregards. Every individual is evaluated for eligibility based on MAGI rules. The MAGI rules are aligned with the income rules that will be applied for determination of eligibility for premium tax credits and cost-sharing reductions through exchanges. The 5% disregard is the amount equal to 5% of the Federal Poverty Level for the applicable family size. It is not a flat 5% disregard from the income. The 5% disregard shall be applied to the highest income threshold. The 5% disregard shall be applied only if required to make someone eligible for Medicaid.¹

Household income is the sum of the MAGI-based income of every individual included in the individual's household, minus an amount equivalent to 5 percentage points of the Federal poverty level for the applicable family size. 42 CFR 435.603.

MA-only eligibility is determined on a calendar month basis. Unless policy specifies otherwise, circumstances that existed, or are expected to exist, during the calendar month being tested are used to determine eligibility for that month. When determining eligibility for a future month, assume circumstances as of the processing date will continue unchanged unless you have information that indicates otherwise. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 105 (April 1, 2017), p 2.

Department policy is consistent with federal regulations under 42 CFR § 435.603(h) that state:

Financial eligibility for Medicaid for applicants, and other individuals not receiving Medicaid benefits at the point at which eligibility for Medicaid is being determined, must be based on current monthly household income and family size.

When budgeting past months, the Department will use amounts actually received/available in the past month. When budgeting income in the processing month, the Department will use amounts already received/available in the processing month and estimate amounts likely to be received/available during the remainder of the month. For future months, the Department will use amounts that will be, or are likely to be, received/available in the future month. For future months, the Department will not budget an extra check (example, fifth check for person paid weekly), and if prospecting income based on bi-weekly or twice a month payments, will multiply by 2. Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 530 (July 1, 2017), pp 3-4.

Petitioner was an ongoing MA recipient under the Health Michigan Plan (HMP) when the Department notified her that she was not eligible for ongoing benefits as of January 1, 2019, based on her income.

Petitioner received bi-weekly paychecks in the gross amounts of \$660.01 and \$660, which represents her income that is likely to continue in the future. Multiplying Petitioner's gross bi-weekly income by 2 as directed by BEM 530 reveals a monthly income of \$1,320. This income represents 130% of the 2018 federal poverty level.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA) as of January 1, 2019.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is REVERSED.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

Initiate a determination of the Petitioner's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA) as of January 1, 2019.
