HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on February 28, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner was represented by [REDACTED], Petitioner. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Valerie Foley, Hearings Facilitator.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly close Petitioner's Food Assistance Program (FAP) case?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner was a FAP benefit recipient.
2. On December 31, 2018, Petitioner's FAP case was closed due to Department error.
3. One of Petitioner's group members was excluded from the FAP group because she is enrolled full time in college and does not meet any of the criteria to be eligible for student status.
4. On January 1, 2019, Petitioner's FAP case was reinstated.

5. On January 17, 2019, the Department sent Petitioner a Notice of Case Action that Petitioner was approved for \$353 per month in Food Assistance Program benefits from January 1-December 31, 2019, for a three-person household.
6. On January 25, 2019, a New Hire Notice was returned by Petitioner which indicates that FK is employed 16 hours per week.
7. The Department conceded on the record that the case was closed in error and is currently pending back to the date of closure.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services The regulations governing the hearing and appeal process for applicants and recipients of public assistance in Michigan are found in the Michigan Administrative Code, MAC R 400.901-400.951. An opportunity for a hearing shall be granted to an applicant who requests a hearing because his or her claim for assistance has been denied. MAC R 400.903(1). Clients have the right to contest a Department decision affecting eligibility or benefit levels whenever it is believed that the decision is incorrect. The Department will provide an administrative hearing to review the decision and determine the appropriateness of that decision. BAM 600.

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

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In this case, the Department's authorized Hearings Representative conceded on the record that it closed Petitioner's case in error. The Department's Representative stated that Petitioner's application should be reinstated and conceded on the record that FAP benefits should be redetermined. Petitioner agreed.


DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Initiate reinstatement of Petitioner's FAP application to the [REDACTED], 2018, closure date;
2. Redetermine eligibility for FAP benefits; and
3. If Petitioner is otherwise eligible, pay to Petitioner any FAP benefits to which she is entitled from the December 31, 2018 closure date forward.
