HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, telephone hearing was held on March 21, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner was represented by her son, [REDACTED] and her husband, [REDACTED]. The Department was represented by Andrea Jones.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner is an ongoing Medical Assistance (MA) recipient.
2. On December 27, 2018, the Department received verification that Petitioner has a bank account with a balance of \$5,426.50 as of November 8, 2018, and \$3,947.22 as of October 11, 2018. Exhibit A, p 5.
3. On January 18, 2019, the Department notified Petitioner that she is not eligible for Medical Assistance (MA) effective March 1, 2019. Exhibit A, p 25.
4. On January 29, 2019, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing. Exhibit A, pp 2-3.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

Assets means cash, any other personal property, and real property. Real property is land and objects affixed to the land such as buildings, trees and fences. Condominiums are real property. Personal property is any item subject to ownership that is not real property. Countable assets cannot exceed the applicable asset limit. An asset is countable if it meets the availability tests and is not excluded. Available means that someone in the asset group has the legal right to use or dispose of the asset. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 400 (January 1, 2018), pp 1-7.

Persons may qualify under more than one MA category. Federal law gives them the right to the most beneficial category. The most beneficial category is the one that results in eligibility or the least amount of excess income. Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 105 (April 1, 2017), p 2.

Petitioner is an ongoing MA recipient and had received benefits under the Healthy Michigan Plan (HMP), which is a category of Medicaid available to clients that are not eligible for Medicare and there is no asset limit. When Petitioner became eligible for Medicare, the Department considered her eligibility for other categories of Medicaid.


However, those other categories of Medicaid have an asset limit, and for an asset group of one the asset limit is \$2,000. On December 27, 2018, the Department received verification that Petitioner has cash assets exceeding \$2,000. On January 18, 2019, the Department notified Petitioner that she no longer meets the eligibility criteria to received MA benefits under any category.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it closed Petitioner's Medical Assistance (MA) benefits effective March 1, 2019.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
