HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, telephone hearing was held on April 4, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner represented herself. The Department was represented by Tiffany Parker and Kathleen Grace.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner is a Food Assistance Program (FAP) recipient as a group of one.
2. Petitioner receives monthly income in the gross monthly amount of \$1,086.
3. Petitioner provided the Department with verification that she is responsible to pay property taxes on her home totaling \$714.71. Exhibit A, p 12.
4. On February 26, 2019, the Department notified Petitioner that she is eligible for a \$15 monthly allotment of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits as of April 1, 2019. Exhibit A, pp 5-8.

5. On March 11, 2019, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing protesting the amount of her monthly allotment of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits. Exhibit A, pp 3-4.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a, and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

The Department will verify shelter expenses at application and when a change is reported. If the client fails to verify a reported change in shelter, the Department will remove the old expense until the new expense is verified. Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 554 (April 1, 2019), p 14.

Petitioner is a FAP recipient as a group of one and she received a gross month income of \$1,086, which was not disputed during the hearing. Petitioner's adjusted gross income of \$928 was determined by reducing her gross income by the \$158 standard deduction.

Petitioner is entitled to a \$139 excess shelter deduction, which was determined by reducing the totaling of her housing expenses and the \$543 standard heat and utility deduction by 50% of her adjusted gross income. Petitioner's housing expenses in the monthly amount of \$59.56 was determined by dividing the annual property tax bill that was verified by 12 months. This property tax bill appears to be only a portion of Petitioner's property tax obligation, but she only provided verification of this portion.


Petitioner's net income of \$789 was determined by reducing her adjusted gross income by the \$139 excess shelter deduction. A group of one with a net income of \$789 is entitled to a \$15 monthly allotment of FAP benefits. Department of Health and Human Services Reference Table Manual (RFT) 260 (October 1, 2018), p 11.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's eligibility for the Food Assistance Program (FAP).

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
