### **HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on June 5, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner was represented by herself. The Department was represented by Lashona Callen.

### **ISSUE**

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly deny Petitioner's application for Medical Assistance (MA)?

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On [REDACTED], 2019, the Department received Petitioner's application for Medical Assistance (MA). Exhibit A, pp 6-11.
2. On April 1, 2019, the Department sent Petitioner a Verification Checklist (DHS-3503) requesting verification of the balance of a checking account and a savings account by April 11, 2019. Exhibit A, pp 12-13.
3. On April 11, 2019, the Department received a bank statement verifying the balance of a checking account. Exhibit A, pp 16-17.
4. On April 22, 2019, the Department notified Petitioner that she was not eligible for Medical Assistance (MA) as of March 1, 2019. Exhibit A, pp 21-23.

5. On April 23, 2019, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing protesting the denial of Medical Assistance (MA). Exhibit A, pp 4-5.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

Assets means cash, any other personal property and real property. Real property is land and objects affixed to the land such as buildings, trees and fences. Condominiums are real property. Personal property is any item subject to ownership that is not real property. Countable assets cannot exceed the applicable asset limit. An asset is countable if it meets the availability tests and is not excluded. Available means that someone in the asset group has the legal right to use or dispose of the asset. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 400 (April 1, 2019), pp 1-7.

Clients must cooperate with the local office in determining initial and ongoing eligibility and this includes the completion of necessary forms. Department of Human Services Bridges Assistance Manual (BAM) 105 (January 1, 2019), p 8.

Verification means documentation or other evidence to establish the accuracy of the client's verbal or written statements. Verification is usually required at application/redetermination and for a reported change affecting eligibility or benefit level when it is required by policy, required as a local office option, or information regarding an eligibility factor is unclear, inconsistent, incomplete, or contradictory. The Department uses documents, collateral contacts, or home calls to verify information. A collateral contact is a direct contact with a person, organization, or agency to verify information from the client. When documentation is not available, or clarification is needed, collateral contact may be necessary. Department of Human Services Bridges Assistance Manual (BAM) 130 (April 1, 2017), pp 1-10.

On [REDACTED], 2019, the Department received Petitioner's application for MA benefits. On April 1, 2019, the Department requested that she provide verification of the balance of a savings account and a checking account by April 11, 2019. On April 22, 2019, the Department had not received any verification of a savings account, or that the savings

account had been closed, and the Department notified Petitioner that her application had been denied.

Petitioner testified that it was assumed that the Department was requesting verification of the balance of the savings account or the checking account, but not both.

However, the intent of the form was to verify cash assets, and both bank accounts were required.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied Petitioner's March 7, 2019, application for failure to provide the Department with information necessary to determine her eligibility to receive benefits.

**DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
