## **HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on May 30, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner was represented by himself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Amber Gibson, Hearing Facilitator.

## <u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner was not eligible for Child Daycare (CDC)?

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On 2019, Petitioner applied for CDC. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 3-10.
- 2. On April 4, 2019, the Department Caseworker sent Petitioner a Notice of Case Action, DHS-1605, because Petitioner was in a Ph.D. program and not eligible for CDC benefits. Department Exhibit 1, pgs. 12-15.
- 3. On April 16, 2019, the Department received a hearing request from Petitioner, contesting the Department's negative action.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Child Development and Care (CDC) program is established by Titles IVA, IVE and XX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 601-619, 670-679c, and 1397-1397m-5; the Child Care and Development Block Grant of 1990, PL 101-508, 42 USC 9858 to 9858q; and the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, PL 104-193. The program is implemented by 45 CFR 98.1-99.33. The Department administers the program pursuant to MCL 400.10 and provides services to adults and children pursuant to MCL 400.14(1) and Mich Admin Code, R 400.5001-.5020.

In this case, Petitioner is a student in a Ph.D. program. As a result, he is not eligible for the CDC program. CDC benefits cannot be approved for graduate, medical, or law school. BEM 703.

# **DECISION AND ORDER**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied Petitioner for CDC benefits because he is a Ph.D. student.

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
