**HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on July 23, 2019, from Detroit, Michigan. The Petitioner was self-represented and had his landlord, [REDACTED] appeared as a witness. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by [REDACTED], Family Independence Manager.

**ISSUE**

Did the Department properly close Petitioner's State Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefit?

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On May 24, 2019, the Department automatically terminated Petitioner's State SSI benefit and issued a Notice of State SSI Payment Change to Petitioner because his federal SSI benefit was suspended and pending investigation.
2. On June 3, 2019, the Department received Petitioner's request for hearing disputing the closure of his benefit.
3. On June 4, 2019, the Department verified with the Social Security Administration (SSA) that Petitioner's SSI benefit had been suspended pending an investigation and resolution of misuse of benefits.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The State SSI Payments (SSP) program is established by 20 CFR 416.2001-.2099 and the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1382e. The Department administers the program pursuant to MCL 400.10.

In this case, Petitioner's State SSI was closed because Petitioner's federal SSI benefit was suspended pending investigation and resolution. Policy provides that "payments are made for only those months the recipient received a regular first of the month federal benefit." BEM 660 (January 2017), p. 1. State SSI payments are not issued for retroactive or supplemental federal benefits. *Id.* Since Petitioner's federal SSI benefit were suspended and he was not receiving the benefit, the Department acted in accordance with policy in closing Petitioner's SSP case.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it closed Petitioner's State SSI benefit.

### **DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
