HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on August 29, 2019, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner represented herself. The Department of Health and Human Services was represented by Engrid Daniels.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for the Food Assistance Program (FAP)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On 2019, the Department received Petitioner's application for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits. Exhibit A, pp 5-11.
- 2. Petitioner received earned income from employment in the gross bi-weekly amounts of \$1,133.36 on May 3, 2019, and \$945.23 on May 17, 2019. Exhibit A, pp 19-20.
- 3. On June 18, 2019, the Department notified Petitioner that she was eligible for a \$63 monthly allotment of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits as of June 1, 2019. Exhibit A, pp 15-17.
- 4. On August 26, 2019, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing protesting the amount of Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits she is receiving. Exhibit A, pp 3-4.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

All earned and unearned income available is countable unless excluded by policy. Earned income means income received from another person or organization or from self-employment for duties for duties that were performed for compensation or profit. Unearned income means all income that is not earned, including but not limited to funds received from the Family Independence Program (FIP), State Disability Assistance (SDA), Child Development and Care (CDC), Medicaid (MA), Social Security Benefits (RSDI/SSI), Veterans Administration (VA), Unemployment Compensation Benefits (UCB), Adult Medical Program (AMA), alimony, and child support payments. The amount counted may be more than the client actually receives because the gross amount is used prior to any deductions. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 500 (July 1, 2017).

All income is converted to a standard monthly amount. If the client is paid weekly, the Department multiplies the average weekly amount by 4.3. If the client is paid every other week, the Department multiplies the average bi-weekly amount by 2.15. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 505 (October 1, 2017), pp 7-8.

On 2019, the Department received Petitioner's application for FAP benefits. The Department determined that she was receiving earned income in the gross monthly amount of \$2,234 by multiplying the average of the two bi-weekly paychecks she had received in May by the 2.15 conversion factor as directed by BEM 505. Petitioner's adjusted gross income of \$1,629 was determined by reducing her total income by 20% of her earned income and the \$158 standard deduction.

Petitioner is entitled to a \$329 deduction for shelter expenses, which was determined by reducing the sum of her \$600 rent obligation and the \$543 standard heat and utility deduction by 50% of her adjusted gross income.

Petitioner's net income of \$1,300 was determined by reducing her adjusted gross income by her shelter deduction. A group of three with a net income of \$1,300 is entitled to a \$115 monthly allotment of FAP benefits. Department of Health and Human

Services Reference Table Manual (RFT) 260 (October 1, 2018), p 18. Petitioner was initially granted a \$63 monthly allotment of FAP benefits, and a \$52 supplement has also been authorized.

Petitioner had reported on her application for assistance that she was responsible for a \$650 monthly rent obligation. The Department will verify shelter expenses at application and when a change is reported. If the client fails to verify a reported change in shelter, the Department will remove the old expense until the new expense is verified. Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 554 (August 1, 2017), p 14. Therefore, the Department is prohibited from applying the increased housing expenses until it is verified, but her eligibility for benefits in the future may change as this expense is verified.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined that Petitioner's eligibility for Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
