

HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on August 26, 2021. Petitioner represented herself and was assisted by The Department was represented by Adele Sumption and Matt Dalman.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for the Medicare Savings Program (MSP)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner applied for the Medicare Savings Program (MSP) on 2021.
- 2. On July 6, 2021, the Department notified Petitioner that she was eligible for Medicare Savings Program (MSP) benefits under the Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB) category effective August 1, 2021. Exhibit A, pp 4-6.
- 3. On July 26, 2021, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing protesting the denial of Medicare Savings Program (MSP) benefits.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396 through 42 USC 1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10 through 42 CFR 420.25. The Department administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.103 through MCL 400.112k of the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1 *et seq.*

The Medicare Savings Programs are SSI-related MA categories. There are three categories of Medicare Savings Program (MSP) benefits including the Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB), the Special Low Income Medicare Beneficiary (SLMB), and the Additional Low Income Medicare Beneficiary (ALMB). QMB pays Medicare premiums, and Medicare coinsurances, and Medicare deductibles. QMB coverage begins the calendar month after the processing month. SLMB pays Medicare Part B premiums. SLMB coverage is available for retro MA months and later months. ALMB pays Medicare Part B premiums provided funding is available. The Department of Community Health notifies the Department of Human Services if funding is available. ALMB coverage is available for retro MA months and later months. Department of Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 165 (October 1, 2020), pp 1-4.

On 2021, the Department received Petitioner's application for assistance with her Medicare Part B premiums. It was not disputed during the hearing that Petitioner's income is at or below the federal poverty level, and that she is eligible for assistance with her Medicare Part B premiums.

However, Petitioner was not eligible to apply for MSP benefits until she was an active Medicare recipient, and Department policy prohibits payment of benefits under the QMB category in the application month. Therefore, Petitioner was not eligible to have the Department pay her Medicare Part B premium for July, which was the application month. Petitioner is eligible for QMB benefits in August of 2021. While Petitioner's Medicare Part B premium was deducted from her August social security benefits, she will be reimbursed by the Department for that amount.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's eligibility for the Medicare Savings Program (MSP).

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
