HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned administrative law judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a hearing was held via telephone conference line on October 17, 2022. Petitioner did not participate. Petitioner's mother, **Example 10**, participated on behalf of Petitioner. The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) was represented by Valarie Foley, hearings facilitator. Lakhdar Semmache of Linguistica International participated as an English-Arabic translator.

ISSUE

The issue is whether MDHHS properly terminated Petitioner's state-issued Supplemental Security Income payment (SSP).

FINDINGS OF FACT

The administrative law judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. As of August 2022, Petitioner was a recipient of Supplemental Security Income (SSI). Petitioner also received ongoing SSP averaging **Security** monthly.
- In September 2022, the Social Security Administration (SSA) stopped Petitioner's SSI payments.
- 3. On August 20, 2022, MDHHS sent Petitioner notice of SSP termination beginning August 20, 2022.
- 4. On September 2, 2022, Petitioner's mother requested a hearing to dispute the termination of SSP.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The State SSI Payments (SSP) program is established by 20 CFR 416.2001-.2099 and the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1382e. MDHHS administers the program pursuant to MCL 400.10.

Petitioner's mother requested a hearing to dispute a termination of Petitioner's SSP benefits. Exhibit A, pp. 3-4. A Notice of State SSI Payment Change dated August 20, 2022, stated that Petitioner was ineligible for SSP beginning August 20, 2022, due to SSI cancellation.¹

SSI is a cash benefit to needy persons who are aged (at least , blind or disabled. BEM 660 (January 2017) p. 1. It is a federal program administered by the SSA. *Id.* States are allowed the option to supplement the federal benefit with state funds. *Id.* In Michigan, SSI benefits include a basic federal benefit and an additional amount paid with state funds. *Id.* SSP is paid quarterly, in the last month of the quarter. SSP is issued for only those months the recipient received a regular first of the month federal benefit. *Id.*

MDHHS presented documentation of Petitioner's SSP history. Exhibit A, p. 5. No SSP benefits were issued to Petitioner in September 2022. No SSP benefits is consistent with Petitioner's mother's acknowledgement that SSA temporarily stopped Petitioner's SSI benefits in September 2022.² Because Petitioner received no SSI in September 2022, MDHHS properly stopped Petitioner's SSP.

DECISION AND ORDER

The administrative law judge, based upon the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, finds that MDHHS properly stopped Petitioner's SSP benefits in September 2022.

The actions of MDHHS are **AFFIRMED**.

¹ Though SSP benefits were stated to stop August 20, 2022, Petitioner's SSP benefits would functionally stop beginning September 2022.

² Petitioner's SSP history documentation also indicated that benefits restarted in October 2022. The restart of SSP coincides with evidence suggesting that SSA also restarted Petitioner's SSI payments.
