HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on January 10, 2023, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner represented himself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Brad Reno, Hearing Facilitator. Department Exhibit 1, pp. 1-11 was received and admitted.

<u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department properly close Petitioner's State SSI Payment (SSP) benefit due to closure of SSI?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner was a recipient of SSP payment based on his receipt of SSI.
- 2. On November 19, 2022, Notice of State SSI Payment change was sent to Petitioner.
- 3. On December 2, 2022, Petitioner requested hearing disputing the closure of his SSP benefit.
- 4. Petitioner did not dispute that he did not receive SSI in November 2022.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The State SSI Payments (SSP) program is established by 20 CFR 416.2001-.2099 and the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1382e. The Department administers the program pursuant to MCL 400.10.

State SSI Payment

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) issues the State SSI Payment (SSP) to SSI recipients in the following living arrangements: Independent living.

Household of another. (Living in the household of another person and receiving partial or total support and maintenance in kind from that person.)
For payment levels see RFT 248 Reference Tables.

Payments are made for only those months the recipient received a regular first of the month federal benefit. These are shown on SOLQ as a **recurring payment dated the first of the month**. BEM 660 (October 2021)

In this case, the Department representative credibility testified at hearing that the Department received notification from the social security administration that Petitioner was no longer receiving SSI. Policy dictates that payments are made for only those months the recipient received a regular first of the month federal benefit. BEM 660 Since Petitioner did not receive a regular first of the month federal benefit it was proper to close his SSP benefit. BEM 660

Petitioner testified at hearing that he was disputing the closure of SSI. It was explained that if that appeal was successful and Petitioner's SSI benefit was reinstated then Petitioner would have the opportunity to seek SSP benefit going forward.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it closed Petitioner's SSP benefit because his SSI benefit closed.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
