## **HEARING DECISION**

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on January 11, 2023, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner represented herself. The Department was represented by Krista Hainey.

## ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly close Petitioner's State Supplemental Security Income (SSP) benefits?

### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. Petitioner was an ongoing State Supplemental Security Income (SSP) recipient when the Department received notification from the Social Security Administration that Petitioner's federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits had been closed.
- 2. On November 19, 2022, the Department notified Petitioner that effective November 19, 2022, her State Supplemental Security Income (SSP) would be cancelled.
- 3. On December 6, 2022, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

Supplemental Security Income (SSI) is a cash benefit to needy persons who are aged (at least 65), blind or disabled. It is a federal program administered by the Social Security Administration (SSA). States are allowed the option to supplement the federal benefit with state funds. In Michigan SSI benefits include a basic federal benefit and an additional amount paid with state funds. The amount of the state benefit varies by living arrangement. Payments of SSP benefits are made for only those months the recipient received a regular first of the month federal benefit. Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 660 (October 1, 2021), p 1.

Petitioner was an ongoing recipient of SSP benefits and her eligibility for those benefits was contingent on her ongoing receipt of regular payment of social security benefits based on disability. When the Social Security Administration notified the Department that her social security benefits had been cancelled, the Department notified Petitioner that her SSP benefits issued by the state of Michigan would also be cancelled.

Petitioner did not dispute that her social security benefits had recently stopped.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it closed Petitioner's State Supplemental Security Income (SSP) benefits.

### **DECISION AND ORDER**

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
