HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on September 26, 2023, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by himself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Valerie Foley Hearing Facilitator. Department Exhibit 1, pp. 1-18 was received and admitted.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny Petitioner's State Disability Assistance (SDA) application due to excess income?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On 2023, Petitioner applied for SDA benefits.
- 2. On July 10, 2023, Notice of Case Action was sent to Petitioner informing him that his SDA application was denied due to excess income.
- 3. Petitioner receives in social security benefits.
- 4. On July 11, 2023, Petitioner requested a hearing disputing the denial of SDA benefits.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program is established by the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b. The Department of Health and Human Services (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the SDA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3151-.3180.

DEPARTMENT POLICY FIP, RCA and SDA Only

The certified group must be in financial need to receive benefits. Need is determined to exist when budgetable income is less than the payment standard established by the department. Program, living arrangement, grantee status and certified group size are variables that affect the payment standard. BEM 515 (January 2022).

In this case, Petitioner receives **and and** in Social Security benefits. The payment standard for SDA for a group size of 1 is \$269. RFT 225. Since Petitioner's social security benefit exceeds the payment standard he is not eligible for SDA. BEM 515. Therefore, the Department denial due to excess income is proper and correct.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied Petitioner's SDA application due to excess income.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
