HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on October 5, 2023, from Lansing, Michigan. [REDACTED] the Petitioner, appeared on her own behalf. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) did not appear for the hearing.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for the Food Assistance Program (FAP)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. In April 2023, Petitioner contacted the Department requesting to add a foster child to the FAP group. (Petitioner Testimony)
2. On August [REDACTED] 2023, Petitioner filed a hearing request contesting the Department's failure to add the foster child to the FAP group. (Hearing Request)
3. The Department subsequently added the foster child to the FAP group for ongoing FAP eligibility only. (Petitioner Testimony)

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) [formerly known as the Food Stamp program] is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

In this case, the Department failed to appear for the October 5, 2023 hearing. Accordingly, the Department was unable to submit the documentation and testimony needed to proceed with an administrative hearing to be able to review the FAP determination for Petitioner's request to add a foster child to her FAP case. Therefore, the Department's determination must be reversed. Accordingly, the Department shall re-determine Petitioner's eligibility for FAP as of the April 2023 request to add the group member and issue notice of the new determination to Petitioner.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not satisfy its burden of showing that it acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's eligibility for FAP.


DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's determination is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO INITIATE THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE THE ORDER WAS ISSUED:

1. Re-determine Petitioner's eligibility for FAP as of the April 2023 request to add the group member.
2. Issue written notice of the determination in accordance with Department policy.
