HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on February 8, 2024, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by herself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Amber Gibson Hearing Facilitator. Department Exhibit 1, pp. 1-20 was received and admitted.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly deny Petitioner's State Emergency Relief (SER) application?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On ██████████ 2023, Petitioner applied for SER seeking assistance with hot water heater replacement.
2. On December 13, 2023, a verification checklist was sent to Petitioner requesting bank account and income verifications.
3. Petitioner provided her bank account statement but did not provide a statement from her pension company.

4. On December 21, 2023, a State Emergency Relief Decision Notice was sent to Petitioner informing her that her application was denied for failing to verify pension income.
5. On January 2, 2024, Petitioner requested hearing disputing the denial of SER.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The State Emergency Relief (SER) program is established by the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b. The SER program is administered by the Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) pursuant to MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.7001-.7049.

INCOME EXPENSES

Unearned Income

Net unearned income must be determined by deducting all of the following from the gross amount received:

- Mandatory withholding taxes.
- Court ordered child support paid, including arrears, but not more than the amount ordered by the court. No deduction is made for paid, voluntary child support.
- Payments for health insurance. premiums that will not be reimbursed. ERM 206

In this case, Petitioner provided her bank account statement showing how much she received for her pension. The Department argued that they needed a statement from the pension company showing the gross amount and net amount of her pension following deductions. Policy requires that the most accurate verification sources should be reviewed. A statement from the pension would be the most accurate verification source and would provide all necessary information including allowable deductions. The Petitioner only provided her bank statement which was inadequate. Therefore, the denial of SER for failing to verify pension income was proper and correct. BAM 130, ERM 206

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied Petitioner's SER application for failing to verify pension income.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
