HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on March 21, 2024, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner represented herself. The Department was represented by Rebecca Ferrill.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA)?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner is an ongoing recipient of Medical Assistance (MA) as a household of five people at times relevant to this hearing.
2. Petitioner's husband received paychecks in the gross amounts of \$██████████ on January 19, 2024, and February 2, 2024. Exhibit A, pp 19-20.
3. Petitioner received paychecks in the gross weekly amounts of \$██████████ on January 5, 2024, \$██████████ on January 12, 2024, \$██████████ on January 19, 2024, and \$██████████ on January 26, 2024. Exhibit A, pp 13-16.
4. On January 18, 2024, the Department notified Petitioner that Medical Assistance (MA) benefits under the Healthy Michigan Plan (HMP) would close effective February 1, 2024. Exhibit A, p 5.
5. On January 29, 2024, the Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing. Exhibit A, p 4.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396 through 42 USC 1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10 through 42 CFR 420.25. The Department administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.103 through MCL 400.112k of the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1 *et seq.*

MAGI for purposes of Medicaid eligibility is a methodology which state agencies and the federally facilitated marketplace (FFM) must use to determine financial eligibility. It is based on Internal Revenue Service (IRS) rules and relies on federal tax information to determine adjusted gross income. It eliminates asset tests and special deductions or disregards. Every individual is evaluated for eligibility based on MAGI rules. The MAGI rules are aligned with the income rules that will be applied for determination of eligibility for premium tax credits and cost-sharing reductions through exchanges. Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 500 (January 1, 2016), pp 3-4.

Modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) is a methodology for how income is counted and how household composition and family size are determined. It is based on federal tax rules for determining adjusted gross income. It eliminates asset tests and special deductions or disregards. Every individual is evaluated for eligibility based on MAGI rules. The MAGI rules are aligned with the income rules that will be applied for determination of eligibility for premium tax credits and cost-sharing reductions through exchanges. The 5% disregard is the amount equal to 5% of the Federal Poverty Level for the applicable family size. It is not a flat 5% disregard from the income. The 5% disregard shall be applied to the highest income threshold. The 5% disregard shall be applied only if required to make someone eligible for Medicaid.¹

Household income is the sum of the MAGI-based income of every individual included in the individual's household, minus an amount equivalent to 5 percentage points of the Federal poverty level for the applicable family size. 42 CFR 435.603.

Petitioner is an ongoing recipient of MA as a household of five people at times relevant to this hearing. The Department received verification that Petitioner and her husband

received a combined income that is 227% of the federal poverty level and the 5% income disregard does not make them eligible for MA benefits under the federal poverty level.

Petitioner testified that a portion of her husband's paycheck is money received in lieu of accepting employer sponsored benefits. This income is considered taxable by the IRS, and therefore, it is countable towards Petitioner's eligibility for MAGI based categories of MA benefits.


Petitioner is not eligible for MA benefits under the HMP category, and the Department will consider her eligibility for MA benefits under other categories that will include a monthly deductible.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined that Petitioner is not eligible for Medical Assistance (MA) under the Healthy Michigan Plan (HMP).

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is AFFIRMED.
