HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on June 13, 2024, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by herself. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Carrie Zeleznick. Department Exhibit 1, pp. 1-23 was received and admitted. Petitioner Exhibit A, pp. 1-20 was received and admitted.

<u>ISSUE</u>

Did the Department properly deny Petitioner's State Disability Assistance (SDA) application due to excess income?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

- 1. On 2024, Petitioner applied for State Disability Assistance.
- 2. Petitioner receives \$943 per month in SSI benefits. (Ex. 1, p.22)
- 3. On April 9, 2024, a Benefit Notice was sent to Petitioner informing her that her SDA application was denied due to excess income. (Ex. 1, pp. 5-8)
- 4. The payment standard for SDA is \$200 per month.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program is established by the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b. The Department of Health and Human Services (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the SDA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10 and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3151-.3180.

RCA and SDA Only

Financial need exists if there is at least a \$10 deficit after income is budgeted. If there is no deficit, the group is ineligible for assistance. Certify denial or closure in Bridges for the benefit month unless the group meets the conditions for temporary ineligibility. BEM 518.

In this case, Petitioner receives \$943 is SSI per month. Petitioner does not have a \$10 deficit after income is budgeted. Therefore, Petitioner is not eligible for SDA. BEM 518 This was the determination made by the Department and it was proper and correct and consistent with Department policy.

At hearing, Petitioner did not dispute her receipt of SSI. Petitioner testified that she was numerous financial needs that are unmet and requested special consideration. The undersigned Administrative Law Judge has no authority of overrule Department policy.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with Department policy when it denied Petitioner's SDA application due to excess income.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.
