HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on April 11, 2024, from Lansing, Michigan. Petitioner represented herself and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was present for the hearing. The Department was represented by Tami Pelham.

ISSUE

Did the Department of Health and Human Services (Department) properly determine Petitioner's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA) and the Food Assistance Program (FAP) (MiCAP) programs?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner was a recipient of Medical Assistance (MA) as a recipient of Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits.
2. Petitioner was a recipient of Food Assistance Program (FAP) under the Michigan Combined Application Project (MiCAP).
3. The Department received notification that Petitioner's Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments stopped.
4. The Department closed Petitioner's Medical Assistance (MA) and Michigan Combined Application Project (MiCAP) benefits on or around November 1, 2023.
5. The Department received Petitioner's request for a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) is funded under the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 through 7 USC 2036a. It is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10 of the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1 *et seq*, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001 through 400.3011.

The Michigan Combined Application Project (MiCAP) is a Food Assistance demonstration project approved by the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS). MiCAP is a series of waivers that allows Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to issue Food Assistance Program (FAP) benefits to Supplemental Security Income (SSI) individuals who qualify for this program.

Petitioner was an ongoing recipient of MA and FAP benefits when the Department received reliable information that Petitioner's SSI payments stopped. Petitioner disputes the closure of her federal SSI payments, but MOAHR has no jurisdiction over that grievance. Petitioner also disputes the coverage of her medical services by an auto-insurance company, but MOAHR has not jurisdiction over that grievance either.

The Department's representative testified that Petitioner was eligible for MiCAP benefits but had no access to information supporting a closure of MA benefits. The Department's representative did not dispute that there was a gap in MA eligibility.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department failed to satisfy its burden of showing that it acted in accordance with Department policy when it determined Petitioner's eligibility for food and medical assistance.

DECISION AND ORDER

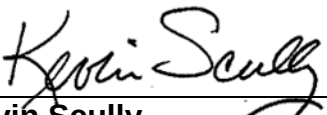
Accordingly, the Department's decision is REVERSED.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Initiate a determination of the Petitioner's eligibility for the Michigan Combined Application Project (MiCAP) as of November 1, 2023.

2. Initiate a determination of the Petitioner's eligibility for Medical Assistance (MA) as of November 1, 2023.
3. Provide the Petitioner with written notice describing the Department's revised eligibility determination.
4. Issue the Petitioner any retroactive benefits she may be eligible to receive, if any.
