HEARING DECISION

Following Petitioner's request for a hearing, this matter is before the undersigned Administrative Law Judge pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; and 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002. After due notice, a telephone hearing was held on January 7, 2025, from Lansing, Michigan. The Petitioner was represented by Attorney David Schaltz. The Department of Health and Human Services (Department) was represented by Assistant Attorney General Chantal Fennessey. Department Exhibit 1, pp. 1-101 was received and admitted.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's divestment penalty period?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. On October 31, 2024, a Health Care Coverage Determination Notice was sent to Petitioner informing him that he was eligible for MA-LTC with a divestment amount of \$ [REDACTED] and a divestment penalty period from December 1, 2024, through March 31, 2025.
2. At hearing, the parties' attorneys agreed that the correct divestment penalty period was from September 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024.
3. On November 4, 2024, Petitioner requested a hearing disputing the dates of the divestment penalty period.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Medical Assistance (MA) program is established by Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 42 USC 1396-1396w-5; 42 USC 1315; the Affordable Care Act of 2010, the collective term for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Pub. L. No. 111-148, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010, Pub. L. No. 111-152; and 42 CFR 430.10-.25. The Department (formerly known as the Department of Human Services) administers the MA program pursuant to 42 CFR 435, MCL 400.10, and MCL 400.105-.112k.

In this case, at hearing, the parties' attorneys agreed that the correct divestment penalty period is from September 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024.

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department did not act in accordance with Department policy when it imposed a divestment penalty period from December 1, 2024, through March 31, 2025.

DECISION AND ORDER

Accordingly, the Department's decision is **REVERSED**.

THE DEPARTMENT IS ORDERED TO BEGIN DOING THE FOLLOWING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT POLICY AND CONSISTENT WITH THIS HEARING DECISION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE DATE OF MAILING OF THIS DECISION AND ORDER:

1. Correct the divestment penalty period to reflect a divestment penalty from September 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024.

Activate MA-LTC effective January 1, 2025, if Petitioner meets all other eligibility requirements.
