HEARING DECISION

On December 19, 2025, Petitioner [REDACTED] requested a hearing to dispute a Food Assistance Program (FAP) determination. As a result, a hearing was scheduled to be held on January 29, 2026. Public assistance hearings are held pursuant to MCL 400.9 and 400.37; 7 CFR 273.15 to 273.18; 42 CFR 431.200 to 431.250; 42 CFR 438.400 to 438.424; 45 CFR 99.1 to 99.33; 45 CFR 205.10; and Mich Admin Code, R 792.11002.

The parties appeared for the scheduled hearing. Petitioner appeared and represented herself. Respondent Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (Department) had Hearing Facilitator Amber Gibson appear as its representative. There were no other participants.

Both parties provided sworn testimony, and one exhibit was admitted into evidence. A 10-page packet of documents provided by the Department was admitted into evidence collectively as Exhibit A.

ISSUE

Did the Department properly determine Petitioner's FAP benefit amount?

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the competent, material, and substantial evidence on the whole record, finds as material fact:

1. Petitioner is a FAP benefit recipient.
2. Petitioner is a disabled individual.
3. Petitioner lives alone.
4. Petitioner's income increased in 2026 due to cost-of-living adjustments.
5. Petitioner became eligible to receive \$ [REDACTED] per month from Social Security SSI in 2026, but \$10.00 per month was withheld to repay an overpayment.
6. Petitioner became eligible to receive \$ [REDACTED] per month from Social Security RSDI in 2026.

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7. Petitioner was also eligible to receive a quarterly State SSI payment of \$ [REDACTED].
 8. Petitioner had a \$245.00 per month rent obligation.
 9. Petitioner was responsible for paying for her heating/cooling utilities.
 10. The Department redetermined Petitioner's FAP eligibility based on Petitioner's increased income for 2026.
 11. The Department determined that the maximum FAP benefit that Petitioner was eligible for was \$212.00 per month. The Department determined Petitioner's FAP benefit amount using the following information:
 - a. Group size of one
 - b. \$ [REDACTED] per month in unearned income
 - c. \$209.00 per month for a standard deduction
 - d. \$245.00 per month for a housing expense
 - e. \$682.00 per month for a heat/utility standard
 12. On December 6, 2025, the Department mailed a notice of case action to Petitioner to notify her that her FAP benefit was going to decrease to \$212.00 per month, effective January 1, 2026.
 13. Petitioner requested a hearing to dispute her FAP benefit amount.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Department policies are contained in the Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Administrative Manual (BAM), Department of Health and Human Services Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM), Department of Health and Human Services Reference Tables Manual (RFT), and Department of Health and Human Services Emergency Relief Manual (ERM).

The Food Assistance Program (FAP) is established by the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, as amended, 7 USC 2011 to 2036a and is implemented by the federal regulations contained in 7 CFR 273. The Department administers FAP pursuant to MCL 400.10, the Social Welfare Act, MCL 400.1-.119b, and Mich Admin Code, R 400.3001-.3011.

In this case, the Department determined that Petitioner was eligible for a maximum FAP benefit of \$212.00 per month, effective January 1, 2026. Petitioner is disputing her FAP benefit amount. Thus, the issue is whether the Department properly determined Petitioner's FAP benefit amount.

The Department determines a client's monthly FAP benefit amount by determining the client's group size and net household income and then looking that information up in its applicable Food Issuance Table. BEM 212 (June 1, 2025), BEM 213 (October 1, 2024), BEM 550 (April 1, 2025), BEM 554 (October 1, 2025), BEM 556 (October 1, 2025), RFT 255 (October 1, 2025), and RFT 260 (October 1, 2025).


Petitioner's gross unearned income totaled \$ [REDACTED] per month in 2026. This amount was calculated as follows: \$ [REDACTED] (gross SSI benefit) - \$10.00 (SSI withholding) + \$ [REDACTED] (gross RSDI benefit) + \$ [REDACTED] (State SSI payment). Based on Petitioner's gross unearned income of \$ [REDACTED] per month, Petitioner's housing cost of \$245.00 per month, and Petitioner's obligation to pay her heating/cooling utilities, Petitioner's net income was \$ [REDACTED] per month. Based on Petitioner's net income of \$ [REDACTED] and Petitioner's group size of one, the maximum FAP benefit amount that Petitioner was eligible for was \$212.00 per month. Accordingly, the Department properly determined that Petitioner was eligible for a FAP benefit amount of \$212.00 per month, effective January 1, 2026.

Although Petitioner may have additional expenses, and Petitioner may not have a net income of \$ [REDACTED] per month to live on, the Department properly used the maximum deductions and standards that it was permitted to use to calculate Petitioner's FAP benefit amount, and the Department properly determined the maximum FAP benefit amount that Petitioner was eligible for.

DECISION AND ORDER

The Administrative Law Judge, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and for the reasons stated on the record, if any, finds that the Department acted in accordance with its policies and the applicable law when it determined Petitioner's FAP benefit amount.

IT IS ORDERED that the Department's decision is **AFFIRMED**.



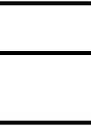
