SAFETY STANDARDS

PART 91. PROCESS SAFETY MANAGEMENT OF HIGHLY HAZARDOUS CHEMICALS

R 408.49101 Scope.

Rule 9101. (1) This part applies to the manufacturing, keeping, having, storing, selling, transporting, and using of explosives, blasting agents, and pyrotechnics. These rules do not apply to the sale and use (public display) of pyrotechnics, commonly known as fireworks, or to the use of explosives in the form prescribed in the official United States pharmacopeia.

(2) The manufacture of explosives, as defined in the provisions of 29 C.F.R. §1910.109(a)(3), explosives, shall also be in compliance with the requirements contained in the provisions of 29 C.F.R. §1910.119.

(3) The manufacture of pyrotechnics as defined in the provisions of 29 C.F.R. §1910.109(a)(10) shall also be in compliance with the provisions of these rules.

R 408.49102 Adoption of standards by reference.

Rule 9102. The federal occupational safety and health administration's regulations on process safety management of highly hazardous chemicals that have been promulgated by the United States department of labor and have been codified at 29 C.F.R. §1910.119, including appendix A, with an effective date of May 26, 1992, and which were amended March 7, 1996, appearing in the Federal Register on pp. 9238, are adopted by reference in these rules as of the effective date of these rules. The definitions referred to in R 408.49101(2) and (3) and codified at 29 C.F.R. §1910.109(a)(3) and (10) are adopted in these rules by reference. The adopted regulations may be obtained from the Michigan Department of Consumer and Industry Services, Standards Division, P.O.
